Since one of RCC's objectives is to serve as a center for education and cultural awareness, public forums and guest speakers may help to enhance this endeavor.

Instructors are free to invite speakers to their classrooms as they see fit. This procedure is not intended to deal with issues, which may be perceived as controversial and/or are a part of classroom material.

Pursuant to Board Policy VII.C.060, Guest Speakers, speakers sponsored by student and/or staff may be invited to speak at the College from time to time, but with some level of assurance that the speakers will present diverse views in the "best tradition of American forum." Speakers should be "intellectually stimulating" and educationally justifiable. If candidates for political office are invited to speak at the College, their opponent(s) should be given equal opportunity to also speak.

General procedures to be followed regarding speakers' presentations are that their presentation is adequately and accurately advertised to all who may be interested, that they show up at the scheduled time and place, and are properly introduced. It should also be clear to the speakers and their audience that speakers are representing their own point of view and do not necessarily reflect endorsement or denial of the views of the RCC Board, staff or students.
